
## **White Limba**

Terminalia Superba





White Limba is harvested in Tropical West Africa and is commonly used in Millwork products such as furniture, veeners, musical instruments, and turned objects. White Limba is rated as non-durable and has poor insect/borer resistance. White Limba's heartwood is a light yellowish to golden brown, sometimes with gray to nearly black streaks and veins, darkening with age. Grain is straight to slightly interlocked; coarse, uniform texture with moderate natural luster.



## Appearance & Grain

Heartwood is a light yellowish to golden brown, sometimes with grey to nearly black streaks and veins. Wood with plain unfigured wood is called White Limba. Sapwood is a pale greyish to yellowish brown, not clearly demarcated from the heartwood. Color tends to darken with age.
